## SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

# 1 RULES

The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*. The first sentence of RRS 40 is changed so that competitors shall comply with the obligations of RRS 40 (wear a PFD) whether or not the Race Committee displays flag Y with one sound.

# 2 NOTICES to COMPETITORS; CHANGES to the SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Signals will be made from the committee boat. Notices to competitors will be posted on the EYC Racing Board, located in the frame next to the bar in the EYC clubhouse. Any changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted not later than 0900 hrs on the day they take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 1800 hrs on the day before it takes effect.

### 3 SCHEDULE

Fri, July 21	1000 1330	Competitors briefing See Attachment 1
Sat, July 22	0930 1155	Competitors briefing First Warning Signal of the day Three races are scheduled. Location is near YRA 10.
Sun, July 23	1155	First Warning Signal of the day Two races are scheduled. Location is in the South Bay near Seaplane.

## **4 COURSE LOCATIONS**

#### Friday:

## Saturday:

The racing area will be in the Central Bay within the vicinity of YRA 10, west of Berkeley Pier. The Race Committee may move the course location due to wind conditions; they will signal this intent by flying the Lima Flag and announcing the new location on VHF 66.


## Sunday:

The racing area will be in the South Bay within the vicinity of Seaplane Lagoon. The Race Committee may move the course location due to wind conditions; they will signal this intent by flying the Lima Flag and announcing the new location on VHF 66.

# 5 CLASS FLAG, COURSES and MARKS

The Class Flag will use flag "G". A numeral pennant will be displayed to indicate the course to be sailed.

Marks will consist of large, orange tetrahedrons or cones for the Start, Finish and "W" marks. A round ball will used for the offset "WO". Two large, yellow tetrahedrons or cones will be used for "G1" and "G2".



Start/Finish Lines are restricted except when preparing to start, starting or finishing.

Mark positions are for illustration only and are not to scale.

## 6 STARTING and FINISHING LINES

All starts will be between the Committee Boat and the orange mark to the Port of the Committee Boat.

All finishes will be between the Committee Boat and the orange mark to the Starboard of the Committee Boat.

## 7 CHECK-IN

Boats shall check in prior to the first warning signal of the day by sailing past the Committee Boat, on starboard tack and hailing the Race Committee, or by contacting the Race Committee on VHF 66.

#### 8 HAILING AFTER the START

When the Race Committee displays Flag X (Individual Recall), the sail number or other clearly distinguishing feature of a boat that caused that signal may be hailed on VHF channel 66. The absence of a hail, the order of a hail or the failure of a boat to hear the hail shall not be grounds for redress. This changes rule 62.1(a).

## 9 PENALTIES

RRS 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

## 10 HAULOUTS

After the preparatory signal for a boat's first race, a boat shall not be hauled out except with and according to the terms of prior written permission of the race committee.

#### 11 PROTESTS

The protest time limit is 1800 hours of the race day. The protest time limit will be posted on the notice board. Hearings will be held as soon as possible after racing each day. A hearing schedule will be posted within 30 minutes of the expiry of the protest time limit. This schedule will serve as notice under rule 63.2.

## 12 SCORING

Five races are scheduled. Three races are required to constitute a championship. All scores except the practice race score(s) will count toward a boat's final regatta score.
